## **FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ~ 18 MAY 2025**

Disciples Love One Another

*Readings:* Acts 14:21-27; Rev 21:1-5a; John 13:31-33a, 34-35

*Scripture:* "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35)

*Reflection:* I remember watching a heated (and then over-heated debate develop at a parish meeting and thinking to myself, "If this is how we treat each other right here in our own parish where we share common values, no wonder we have trouble showing love to people whose values are completely different than our own." But then again, maybe it's easier to act lovingly to people we don't know! Today's Gospel scene occurs just after Jesus has washed the feet of his disciples as they gather for their last meal together. I can't help but wonder what would have happened at our parish meeting had someone in leadership quietly filled a bowl with water, grabbed a towel, and started washing feet. I'm serious! With our socks and shoes removed, totally unprepared for this ritual, we would all have been on common ground, reduced as it were, to pairs of dirty feet. I have a feeling it would have stripped away the anger and helped us reason together in more loving and respectful way. In these hours before Jesus is arrested, he is still concerned with his divine mission to demonstrate God's love to all people, His disciples will only be able to bear witness to him, to welcome others into their community, insofar as they demonstrate love among themselves: respectfully honest with one another, quick to forgive, generous in service, and joyful in their common faith.

*Meditation:* Flight attendants begin each flight with safety announcements, including instructions to put on your oxygen mask first before helping others do the same in an emergency, It's not a selfish act; it's essential and practical. Could showing love to others in our faith communities be likened to that procedure? Can we work on loving each other there first so that we are then able to witness effectively to others that our God is love?

*Prayer:* Jesus, you command us to love as you love. Give us this day the determination to be generous in our relationships with fellow parishioners.

## LITURGY OF THE WORD ~ 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

*First Reading* (Acts 14:21-27) Paul and Barnabas retrace their steps, encouraging the little communities of Christians they had founded.

*Second Reading* (Rev 21:1-5) Taken from the final part of Apocalypse, this opens with the vision of a new world and the new order of things inaugurated by Christ.

*Gospel* (Jn 13:31-35) During the Last Supper Jesus gives his apostles a new commandment—to love one another as he has loved them.

Next weeks readings: Acts 15:1-2.22-29; Rev 21:10-14.22-23; Jn 14:23-29.

**Our Lady of Manaoag**, also known as Nuestra Señora del Santo Rosario de Manaoag, is a revered Marian figure in Pangasinan, Philippines. The image of Our Lady of Manaoag is believed to have miraculous powers, and believers seek to touch it for healing. Pope Pius XI granted a Pontifical decree of canonical coronation to the image on 25 August 1925. The rite of coronation took place on 21 April 1926.

Pope Benedict XVI raised her sanctuary in equal indulgences to the Basilica of Saint Mary Major on 21 June 2011. Pope Francis further elevated the shrine to the status of a Minor Basilica on 11 October 2014. The Feast Day of Our lady of Manaoag is celebrated on the Sunday closest to the 3rd Wednesday after Easter.

Today there will be a second collection to support our seven Auckland seminarians discerning their priestly vocations at Holy Cross Seminary. If you are able, please prayerfully consider making a donation to support our future priests.
